OBJECTIVES

The overall objective of the project is to improve the performance of PBPNR planners.

The immediate objective is to enhance the quality of training provided to planners by improving the knowledge and training tools of trainers.

The ultimate beneficiaries are citizens, land owners, NGO's, SME's etc. having an interest towards natural resources use, and who are served by PBPNR planners.

Primary target groups of the project are teachers and trainers in institutions which provide training to PBPNR planners.

KEY CONCEPTS

Transfer of innovation, EnTraCoP, CoPack+ Collaboration, Programme Based Planning, Participatory Planning

TASKS

- 1. Scanning the new collaborative planning and decision support methods and process models.
- 2. Selecting and listing the most relevant methods and models in demonstration and evaluation workshops in all partner countries.
- 3. Re-designing the trainer's tool package CoPack.
- 4. Testing the suitability and attractiveness of the developed new elements of the CoPack+ for the target groups in test courses.
- 5. Evaluating the results of the test courses.
- 6. Finalizing the CoPack+.



FIRST MEETING IN BRNO, CZECH REPUBLIC 20--21 OCTOBER 2010

1st meeting of the project took place in Brno, Czech Republic on 20-21 October 2010. The aim of the meeting was to learn to know each other and to give the project a good start. A part of partner group knew each other from previous projects and some were newcomers. During the two days the group developed towards partnership and common aims were found.
